



A Legacy of Support

In 1950, a group of concerned and caring mothers rallied together to meet a need for special education. One of the most prominent founding mothers and lifetime supporters of OPARC was Mrs. Sally Keechler.

Having a disabled son of her own, Sally knew the challenges children with disabilities routinely faced. After hearing of a couple whose child had been rejected from public school because of a learning disability, Sally started a class in her home for 15 children.

That one class expanded to three to meet the growing need and later that year, Sally helped to organize and bring to life the organization we now call OPARC.


