Timmy is one of the 235 participants of the Work Activity Program that are currently employed. In this program, participants receive vocational skills training, speech pathology lessons, paid work experience, and individual case management services.

Timmy describes himself as "industrious" because of his love for working hard. He currently works in general assembly and packaging where he does quality control, uses the heat seal, gets pallets ready for delivery, and inspects products. His other responsibilities include making bolts, shoes, and getting materials ready and to the right assembly line. He enjoys working and due to his love of trains, he has fun imagining that he is working for the City of Industry Union Pacific Railroad, Metrolink, and Amtrak.

Besides all the fun he has at work, Timmy also enjoys OPARC events. When asked if he would be participating in OPARC's Heart & Sole Walk & Roll this year, he excitedly replied, "YES! I am the very first one to sign up for OPARC functions like the Turkey Bowl, and the Fun Run; I am the very first to come to the starting line."

When Timmy is not working hard at the Work Activity Program, he can be found riding his bike, drawing maps, running his electrical train, or watching his favorite show, Dr. Ken on ABC.
